

Amen



Have you ever considered the word "Amen?" We often use it to express agreement or affirmation, like when I asked you to say "Amen." But what does this word truly mean?

- If you are happy to be in church today, say Amen!
- If God has been good to you, say Amen!
- If you have ever received a miracle, say Amen!
- If you were blessed in last Sunday's service, say Amen!

"Amen" (Aw Men) originated in Hebrew and means "Verily, Truly, So Be It." It is closely related to the Hebrew word "Aman" (Aw Man), which means to trust, believe, stand firm, be certain, faithful, reliable, verified, confirmed, made firm, and steadfast.

The New Testament translated it directly from Hebrew into Greek. Later, it was translated directly into Latin, English, and other languages. It has the same meaning in Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. For instance, in Islam, 'Ameen' is used at the end of a prayer to agree with what was said. It is Truly a universal word.

If Amen is used at the beginning of a conversation, it means that what the person is about to say is true and trustworthy. The word "Verily" used by Jesus in the Gospels, especially in the Sermon on the Mount, is the same as "Amen." So, when Jesus said, "Verily, Verily, I say unto you," he was telling us that what he was about to say was spoken with authority and that you could be certain it was truthful, reliable, verified, and confirmed.

Psalm 41:13 (KJV): Blessed be the Lord God of Israel from everlasting, and to everlasting. Amen, and Amen.

Romans 11:36 (KJV): For of him, and through him, and to him, are all things: to whom be glory forever. Amen.

When Amen is said after someone makes a statement, as we did earlier, or when the pastor says something profound, it signifies that you are claiming what the person said is true, accepting it, and making it your own.

When you utter the word 'Amen' at the conclusion of a statement or prayer, you are doing more than just agreeing. You are declaring: So be it! May it be fulfilled! It is final! This act of affirmation empowers you, reinforcing your faith and belief in what you have just said or prayed for.
