One Accord

Accord comes from the Greek word *homothumadon* (hom-oth-ou-mad-on), which means to be of one mind or passion.

We often focus on individual spiritual growth and our relationship with God. However, being in one accord requires humility, selflessness, and a willingness to put aside our differences and unite as one body under Christ.

In music, being in one accord is expressed when each instrument plays the same pitch and tone in perfect harmony. When one note is out of sync, it causes discord and ruins the entire piece. When we pray, we tend to wait until everyone gives their request, and then we pray together, but each person prays in their own way and order. We are out of sync with each other. On the Day of Pentecost, all of those gathered were focused on a single event: the falling of the Holy Ghost.

The Sound from Heaven

The sound from heaven on the day of Pentecost was described as a rushing, mighty wind, which was not a physical wind but rather the powerful presence of God's Holy Spirit. The sound from heaven represented a new beginning and spiritual life for believers.

Cloven Tongues of Fire

The appearance of cloven tongues of fire upon each person symbolized the Holy Spirit dwelling within them. In the Bible, fire often represents purification and refining. In this instance, it represented the purifying work of the Holy Spirit within believers.

Speaking in Tongues

After being filled with the Holy Spirit, early Christians began to speak in other tongues or languages, not just gibberish but actual languages that they had yet to learn. This was a miraculous sign of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and served as a way to spread the gospel to people from different languages and cultures, a precursor to Christianity's global reach.

The Power of Unity

The events of Pentecost demonstrate the immense power that comes when believers are united in one accord and filled with the Holy Spirit. They remind us that we are all members of one body, with different gifts and backgrounds but united in our faith in Christ. When we come together in unity, empowered by the Holy Spirit, there is no limit to what can be accomplished for God's kingdom., which should inspire and motivate us to strive for unity in our own lives and communities.

When we pray together, being in one accord doesn't mean simply gathering in the same place. On the Day of Pentecost, everyone gathered in the Upper Room agreed to wait for the Holy Spirit no matter how long it took. They were focused on that singular purpose and had no discord, conflict, friction, disagreement, or dissent in their prayers, which underscores the importance of being in one accord in our prayers, a practice that can bring us closer to God and each other.
